It has been the vision of many members of the community to build an outdoor war memorial commemorating our local servicemen and -women. 2016 is the year it will hopefully be built.

We really want to create something special at which relatives, locals and visitors alike can pay tribute to those who have served.

We want people to be able to do this at any time, not just when the Hall happens to be unlocked (as our current honour boards hang inside). We want to create something unique that complements and suits Greenethorpe.

The Hall Committee is applying to the Department of Veteran Affairs for a small grant, and we are hoping that funds raised at the Carnivale Ball will also go towards the construction of the new memorial.

The Hall committee is also welcoming any donations towards the building costs of the planned memorial. Some very kind donations have already started coming in which is fantastic. The back section of our Soldiers Memorial Hall was actually funded in a similar way, with many locals wanting to assist with the extension of this important community-owned building. From a strong contingency of city based roasters and a record number of over 302 entries at this year's awards, Adrian is honoured that a regionally based family business can take out the award using an Australian product. "It just makes the win so much sweeter" says Adrian who is a passionate believer and advocate for direct trade relationships with the growers he purchases the green coffee bean from.
