Grenfell Record Mon 6 Jun 1921

The building of the Soldiers' Memorial Hall is to be started on June 4th. Much of the work such as providing the materials for preliminary operations will be done voluntarily, thus adding to the value of the subscriptions of those doing this work.

For those who saw this truck on Tuesday 30th August outside the SM Hall, and wondered what was happening:



The front section was added to the Hall after WWII. A huge crack had developed between the sections as the front was moving, and something drastic needed to be done. After deliberation, and consultation with Weddin Shire Council, Mainmark engineering, who specialise in fixing problems like this, were hired. After boring holes, they pumped geopolymer resin into the ground under the front of the Hall to raise it (by about 16mm) and hopefully stabilise it there.

This has taken most of the Hall Committee's working capital, so we look forward to your continued support at fundraising events. We hope to see the Hall last another 100 years!

[cont'd] The plan of the building, which is to be of brick, provides for a floor-space of 60ft. by 30ft, with a 13ft. stage. Two ante rooms each 15ft. by 14ft., will provide accommodation at the rear for the School of Arts and a committee room. Mr. R. K. Dempster has gladly consented to lay the foundation stone, which will bear the names of those who enlisted in this district for service at the great war and paid the supreme sacrifice.

The committee, under the presidency of Mr. J. Fisher, with Mr. Daley as hon. secretary, have spared no effort to make a complete success of the dual scheme. The residents of the district generally are assisting in the movement, and there is no doubt that others in sympathy will also respond. Mr. C. H. Freudenstein has generously donated the two allotments on which the hall is to be built.
