Inquest for Donald Crawford, continued

Constable Snape (recalled) :
When he went to Crawford's on morning of 4th March he noticed Crawford's bed – it had the appearance as if someone had slept in it – the blankets were all in a heap at the foot of the bed.
To the Coroner: Could not say if that would be that night or some previous night.
The Coroner called for any evidence that any person might give that might throw light on the matter.

Dr. Ercole said he would like to give additional evidence and deposed:
Heard in evidence that the hour of tea on night of 3rd was about 7 to 7.30 ; heard the hour of drinking the beer was 10 to 12; he understood that deceased saw Snape at 1.45; so deceased would have started for Greenethorpe from his farm half an hour before – at 1.15; that brings him to conclude that from the time deceased would have drunk the alleged portion of beer to the time he started for Greenethorpe

would be one hour and 5 minutes; he believed that a meal of the quality and quantity which Griffin mentioned would have been digested by deceased in about five hours, that is by the time he drank the beer his stomach would have been empty; under this condition he did not think if the beer was poisoned he could have undertaken the trip.

To Sergeant Ryan: He assumed the times Griffin gave were true.

F. Neal (recalled): He was with Snape and Griffin when tracks were examined round the house; at the spot Snape concluded a horse had been tied up; he would not think a horse had been tied there – not by the quantity of hoof marks.

To the Coroner: A horse had been standing where the glass was found.

Evidence concluded at 4.40, and the Coroner announced he would give his verdict at 4.45.
