WEDDIN SHIRE COUNCIL STRONGER COUNTRY COMMUNITIES FUND (SCCF) ROUND THREE

Round Three of the NSW Government's SCCF is now open and will provide an additional \$100 million for community projects in regional NSW. In 2019 there will be an increased focus on young people aged 12-24 and a broader scope of eligible projects including programs as well as local infrastructure. Funding will be allocated to projects that clearly demonstrate community support for projects and align with the program objectives. The funding available for projects in the Weddin Shire is \$766,618. Applications close **5pm Friday 27 September, 2019** with successful projects expected to be announced from January 2020.

(From Our Own Correspondent).

The great harvest of 1912 is now drawing to a close. All the wheat, except a few hundred bags, is in now, and farmers are beginning to commence ploughing operations for the season of 1913, and it is to be hoped it will be as good as the one which is now finishing up.

The heat has been intense this last week, and I believe myself it was one of the hottest weeks that I have put in since the summer commenced. It continued up till Friday, when black clouds began to come up over the Weddin Range, and we knew well that we were in for a storm then. And so it proved. About seven or eight o'clock in the evening heavy peals of thunder and vivid flashes of lightning began, and between 9 and 10 o'clock rain commenced to fall, and gradually became heavier and heavier, until it came down in torrents. Unfortunately, it did not last long. It was in a hurry to get somewhere else before daybreak, but all the same we were thankful for what we got. On Saturday it was a little cooler than it was on the preceding days.

As I was driving between Inandra and Koorawatha on Saturday, I noticed some very fine stacks of hay along the route. Some were being thatched, and some had wood for the engines alongside of them, which indicates that they are to be cut up for chaff. Others had chaff cutters ready at their sides, waiting for Monday morning to come, to make a start on them.
