THE building of the Soldiers' Memorial Hall is to be started on June 4th. Much of the work such as providing the materials for preliminary operations will be done voluntarily, thus add-ing to the value of the subscriptions of those doing this work. The plan of the building, which is to be of brick, provides for a floor-space of 60ft. by 30ft, with a 13f<sup>t</sup>. stage. Two ante rooms each 15ft. by 14ft., will provide accommodation at the rear for the School of Arts and a com-Mr. R. K. Demp mittee room. ster has gladly consented to lay the foundation stone, which will bear the names of those who enlisted in this district for service at the great war and paid the supreme sacrifice. The committee, under the presidency of Mr. J. Fisher, with Mr. Daley 88 hon. secretary, have spared no effort to make a complete success of the dual scheme. The residents of the district generally are assisting in the move-ment, and there is no doubt that others in sympathy will also respend. Mr. C. H. Freudenstein has generously donated the two allotments on which the hall is to be built.
